# What Happens When Districts Support and Integrate Social and Emotional Learning?

## Program Improves Teachers' Knowledge, But Not Student Achievement

A content-focused professional development program improved fourth-grade teachers' knowledge and some aspects of their instruction, but not their students' achievement, finds an AIR study of 165 teachers in five states. Study participants were enrolled in a professional development program designed to deepen their knowledge of K-8 math.

## In Minnesota, Popular Majors Don't Always Yield Higher Salaries

A study of graduates' salaries up to four years after earning a credential from Minnesota's colleges and universities finds a disconnect between the popularity of majors and future earnings. The trend exists at the bachelor's and master's levels.
